May General Meeting

The Texas Legation Papers

Dr. Greg Cantrell, a history professor at TCU, spoke at the May General Meeting about the missing Texas Legation Papers.

Texas dispatched representatives to Washington, D. C., after President Jackson proclaimed it as an independent state at the very end of his tenure in office. These representatives thus formed the Texas Legation to the USA. The legation became redundant when Texas was admitted to the Union in 1846. Most of the papers of the legation arrived in Austin in short order, and the Texas State Archives is the custodian.

It seems that two boxes remained in the hands of Sam Houston and his family. It is not clear why these particular boxes did not reach the State Archives. In addition, a neighbor rescued the boxes during a fire which consumed the Houston home, and the neighbor never returned them to the Houston family.

In due course, the descendants of the neighbor decided to hold an auction for the right to keep these documents for a period of five years. At the end of this time, the boxes will be placed in the Texas State Archives.

A benefactor of TCU obtained the right to the boxes. At present the documents are being restored as much as possible, and the contents are being transcribed onto CD.
