The glitz and glamour of Hollywood have played a notable role in Fort Worth’s cultural history. At least four movies—including one titled “Fort Worth” -- have staged premieres in Cowtown. And there is a long list of movie stars who came to the city to promote films – stars such as James Stewart, Maureen O’Hara, Greer Garson, Ginger Rogers, Adrienne Ames, Norm Alden, Gary Cooper, Randolph Scott, and Glenn Ford.

In a presentation on February 13 at the FWISD Archives, well-known Fort Worth historian and lecturer, Max Hill, will discuss how the glitter of the silver screen has influenced Cowtown. He will tell of the colorful history of Fort Worth’s famed downtown theaters – the Hollywood, Worth and Palace -- and recall an era when seeing movies at drive-in theaters was a weekly highlight for many families.
