

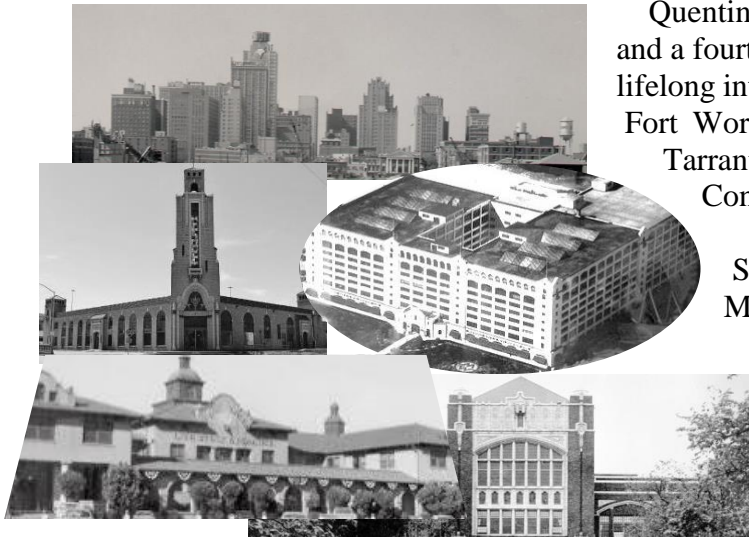

Quentin McGown is a sixth generation Texan and a fourth generation Fort Worth attorney with a lifelong interest in history, especially the history of Fort Worth. He is a noted historian, associate Tarrant County probate judge, author, and Continuing Education professor at TCU.
