The Garden of Eden is located south of Haltom City and has been owned by the Sanders family for more than 100 years. You will want to come and hear what was going on in this area while pioneers were busy relocating here in hopes of a better life. Peter’s Colony was dispensing free land, and the activity led to the development of a viable community.

Sanders Family members were brought to this area as slaves and later developed their property into the very first African American Cultural and Historic District as designated by the City of Fort Worth.

Andrew will have books for sale. I have read this book and it is very informative and lends to the cultural diversity that was introduced by this family.
