Nancy Maxwell has been doing her family genealogies since 1981. She is descended from Russian Jews and Armenians from Turkey who all arrived in America after 1900 and settled in Massachusetts and New York City.

She received her B. A. in English from California State University, Fullerton, M. S. in Library Science from the University of Southern California, and M. A. in History from the University of North Texas.

She is now working on her Ph.D. in American History at UNT, with a focus on the colonial and Revolutionary eras.

Nancy has been the genealogy librarian at Grapevine Public Library since July 2001 where she manages the collection, gives genealogy programs (beginners to advanced), and speaks to the local *Name Droppers* genealogy interest group as well as to outside groups. She also works to have young people learn the joys of genealogy.

Nancy has compiled two books that have been published by Heritage Books; *Washington County, Arkansas Sheriff's Census for 1865* (1994) and *Washington County, Arkansas Miscellaneous Record Book, 1841-1879* (1997), as well as a few family history genealogical articles for genealogical society journals.
