June and July Meetings

On Monday, June 24th, the FWGS held its general meeting at the Fort Worth Public Library Auditorium. Vice President Don Crews presided. The guest speakers were Elaine Pickarski, Administrative Manager of Greenwood - Mount Olivet - Arlington Funeral Homes and Cemeteries; Janet Livingston, Registrar for the Mount Olivet Cemetery; and Mary Galindo, Registrar for the Greenwood Cemetery. They discussed the history of the two cemeteries, which date back to 1907 and 1909, and the organization of their records. The Funeral Home does not allow access to its files because of privacy concerns, but the staff will do genealogical research when they have time. They will release dates of birth, death and burial; cemetery lot location; copies of obituaries and news articles; and name of the Funeral Home. Each contributed to an interesting program on funeral home and cemetery record research.

There were 42 members and guests at the meeting.

Our next meeting will be held on Monday, July 29th, and will be held in the Auditorium at the Downtown Public Library, as usual. Our guest speaker will be Judge Steven King of the Probate Court who will be speaking on the subject of "Researching Probate Records". This should be of interest to most of the membership.
