His presentation will be about the records of the Civil War, particularly the published set of "War of the Rebellion: A Compilation of the Official Records of the Union and Confederate Armies". As usual, the meeting will be at 7:00 pm in the Fort Worth Public Library Tandy Lecture Hall. Parking is free on the meters around the Library after 6:00 pm and in the Sundance Parking lot on 3rd and Taylor after 7:00 pm. Come early to do research in the Genealogy unit and for refreshments. Coffee will be available at 6:30 pm.

February Regular Monthly Meeting

On February 23rd, the general meeting of the FWGS was held at the Fort Worth Public Library. More than thirty members and guests enjoyed hot coffee and cookies brought by Fred and Virginia Brown. President Rob Yoder called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, asked that the minutes and treasurer's report be read, and made several announcements. Vice President Weldon Hudson then presented the speaker for the evening. The speaker, Tom Clark, a public affairs specialist for the Social Security Administration, discussed the federal benefits program. The records of the SSA have genealogical value and are available to the public after the recipient's death. An index of the late recipients is available on the Internet at ssdi.genealogy.rootsweb.com/cgibin/ssdi.cgi and other sites, none of which are endorsed by the federal government. Once you have determined that a recipient has died, you can apply for a copy of the original application. The address to apply is SSA, Office of Earnings Operation, FOIA Workgroup, P. O. Box 33022, Baltimore, MD 21290 or you can contact your local SSA office. The cost is \$27.00 if you know the decedent's number. Tarrant County Marriage Index

For Tarrant County researchers, a marriage index recently became available on the Internet. At www.tarrantcounty.com, you can click free of charge on the marriage records. The database is searchable by name of the bride or groom, by the certificate number, and by range of dates of either the application or marriage. It contains the license number, names of the groom and bride, the dates of the application and marriage, and volume and page number. You can then contact the County Clerk's Office to obtain a copy of the actual record. The time period for the database is 1945 to the present. There is still a gap between Weldon Hudson's and Helen Markgraf's books that cover 1876 to 1901 and this database. Like all computer records, there is numerous data entry. For example, one look up brought up a marriage that occurs in the year 2655. Nonetheless, genealogical researchers have a new, invaluable tool to use.
