Civil War Monument Dedication

During the spring of 2004 three Collevville old-timers decided to erect a Community Civil War Veterans Memorial. On it, they planned to honor not only the men who left this area to serve in the Confederate army, but all the veterans of both armies who moved here in the years after 1865. A website and the monument located on Pleasant Run Road at Pleasant Run Baptist Church are the results of their decision.

The completed project will consist of a marble dedicatory stone and three upright granite tablets, each five feet tall, two feet wide, and six inches thick, on which will be engraved the veterans' names.

A formal marker dedication service will be on Saturday morning, June 11, 2005, at 9 a.m., at Pleasant Run Baptist Church in Colleyville, Texas. Project Website: http://home.flash.net/~coley/mike_cw.html
