## **Change is Coming**

In an effort to trim our expenses, the FWGS Board of Directors made the decision to make a major change in our newsletter. By May, we will convert to electronic publication and distribution. Soon, members will receive their newsletters via e-mail, instead of snail-mail. The elimination of printing and postage will save the Society over \$700 per year in expenses.

Some members have already begun receiving newsletters over the Internet. If you are not receiving your newsletter by e-mail, then we do not have your correct address. Please send your e-mail address to us at FWGS@mail.com in order to continue receiving news from the Society.

The original FWGS Mailing List will not handle attachments so we're setting up direct mail from FWGS@mail.com. If you are using spam filters, please be sure to add FWGS to your trusted sites, or add us to your address book. It will take some time to set up the mailing process and iron out all of the bugs. For a few months you may continue to receive a paper version.

Why the change? - Well, we have been experiencing negative cash flow in the general fund for about eight years and have been dipping into our publishing fund to balance the budget. The publishing fund was created years ago to finance our book projects. We have depleted it to the point where it will be extremely difficult for us to publish future hardback books. Our current projects are planned to be published on CD-ROM, a more economical option.

Another board action moved our inventory storage into a much smaller and very cramped room which should save over \$500 per year. So far we have trimmed about \$1,200 from the budget, but we're only about half way there. There is more work to do.

Footprints (our largest expense and at the same time our greatest asset) has been dodging budget cuts every year. Most of us do not want to take steps that change our treasured quarterly; however, we cannot ignore the immediate need to trim more from the budget. Unless there is a significant increase in the cost of publishing, we believe we can allow Footprints to finish 2007 without cuts; however, you can probably expect a big change the following year. We are consistently watching other societies cut back to two issues yearly, drop from the exchange program, or just stop publication entirely.

We value your input. Your ideas and suggestions are welcome.
