#### Land Measurements in Spanish and Mexican Land Grants

These land grants employ measurements that are quite strange to the current residents. These definitions apply to land grants made in Texas. They also apply to the land grant to the Capital Syndicate for the purpose of funding construction of the State Capital. I obtained this information from http://www.flbatexas.com/landmea.htm.

Vara – 33 1/3 inches

League – A tract of land which is 5000 by 5000 varas. (4428.4 acres) Labor – A tract of land which is 1000 by 1000 varas. (177.136 acres)

Acre - 5645.4 square varas

Older documents may also use these English surveying measures:

One link - 7.92 inches

One rod or pole - 25 links - 5.94 varas - 5 ½ yards - 16 ½ feet

One chain - 4 rods

One caballerias - 108 acres

In very olden times, a chain meant the length of the chain which the surveyor owned. And, a link was just the size of a link in that particular chain, such imprecision makes life interesting for surveyors.
