

Project IOGENE

Kathleen Murray, IOGENE Project Manager at the University of North Texas, sent this update to members of the IOGENE Project Committee. Jim Norris is the representative for the FWGS to this committee.

I am pleased to update you on the IOGENE project. I appreciate how busy each of you is and I did not want to ask you to come to Denton until the project team could show you substantial progress on the first release of the newly designed interface to the Portal to Texas History. We now expect this to be possible in the early months of 2009. So, please look forward to coming to Denton in that timeframe so that we can hear your reactions and feedback. I will be in touch at a later date to set up a convenient meeting time.

In the meantime, we could use your help promoting participation from genealogists in your societies and organizations in our online survey (http://digital2.library.unt.edu/survey). The survey is brief and will provide us with a baseline of user satisfaction with the Portal prior to introducing the new interface next Spring.

I have also posted a brief summary of our project activities on our website (http://iogene.library.unt.edu/). The summary highlights the participation of genealogists in our research, from February through April of this year.

Reports of the findings from the focus groups and usability tests were published last Summer. These findings formed the basis of the functional requirements for the Portal interface redesign effort. The reports as well as the requirements are available at: http://iogene.library.unt.edu/?page_id=87

Currently, a prototype design for the new interface is well underway and development in support of new features and functionality has begun. We are very pleased to be able to address many of the issues and to offer many of the features identified by the genealogists who participated in our focus groups and testing.

The statue of Will Rogers riding his horse into the sunset was given to the City of Fort Worth by Amon Carter (long time publisher of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram) in memory of his close friend, Will Rogers. Mr. Rogers perished in Alaska while on an around the world trip in the early 1930s.

Mr. Carter also gave a statue of Will Rogers to Texas Technological University in Lubbock, Texas.
