### BYUTV

A resource which is not widely appreciated is the genealogy program "Questions and Ancestors" which BYUTV broadcasts. In late July, they rebroadcast a program which discussed the ongoing digitization of all of the Family History documents (microfilm and microfiche) which owned by the Family History library. The site is generally described as Granite Mountain. While the expected life of the film is in excess of 300 years, finding a given source document can be difficult. Hence, there is a need for getting the resources online. The expected project end date mentioned in the program was 2013 to 2014.
