Meg Hacker (at right) of the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) discussed the upcoming release of the 1940 Census on April 2, 2012 at 8:00 AM. This date follows the 72 year rule which when originally adopted insured that most people contained within the census were no longer alive. The editor can assure you that this is no longer the case.

Meg discussed at length the census questionnaire which is quite different from previous census forms. She also covered steps which an interested person might take to get ready for the new archives. These steps are discussed on the next two pages.

If you know where the person lived in 1940, search <u>http://archives.gov/research/search/</u> The 1940 Census enumeration district descriptions may be viewed only. Enter "1940 Census maps + the county + the state". You can narrow the search by including town name in the search. The ED number should be a two part number separated by a hyphen: i.e. **3-46.** 

Save the ED number for the opening of the 1940 Census on April 2, 2012 when you will be able to search the digitized images by ED number for the person in question.

If your relative lived in the same place in 1930 and 1940, consult <u>www.stephenmorse.com</u>. This site will help you determine the 1940 ED.

If you don't know where the family was living in 1940, then you should wait for the genealogical websites to index the names in the ED. This might take 6-12 months.

If you are still stumped, refer to <u>www.archives.gov.research/census/1940/finding-aids.html</u> for more information.
