Ed's father: John Carson Norris b. 13 Feb 1888, OK d. 1940 m. Elsie Neal [she died1938]

[prior to John's death, he had been hospitalized when Edward was abt 13 yrs. old]

John Carson Norris lived in Fort Worth, Tarrant TX 1930c, 1920c

- " registered for the WWI draft in Tarrant County, Fort Worth; states Kosse, TX birth.
- " living in <u>Fort Worth</u> with mother? [Sarah Norris/aka Carrie], two older brothers, Ray & Grady and sister and brother-in-law Carrie and Lee Porter He was 22. 1910c
- " living in Township 8, Chickasaw nation, Indian Territory with ?mother Carrie Norris and his older siblings. He was 12. 1900c
- A. B. Norris [most likely John Carson's father] m. C. J. Norris [?Carrie] living in Kosse, Limestone TX 1880c living with them is: Thaddeus S. Norris, Ada C. Norris

living in same vicinity is: John Norris [most likely A. B.'s father] m. Rebecca; Abner/Abby, Peter, J
