Austin, Texas Texas State Library and Archives

In keeping with the State of Texas' plan to have state government agencies adopt the

texas.gov domain name, the Texas State Library and Archives Commission (TSLAC) now has a new website address. Please update your Internet bookmarks to: www.tsl.texas.gov.

While the web address is changing the physical address stays the same: **1201 Brazos St., Austin TX 78701**

And also from the Texas State Library:

Family historians, scholars, students and others interested in what is behind the ornate brass doors of the Lorenzo de Zavala State Archives and Library Building just east of the Capitol will soon have more opportunities for discovery.

Beginning **January 11, 2014**, the Texas State Library and Archives Commission (TSLAC) will expand its hours of operation to better accommodate researchers. The agency's three public service areas – the Texas State Archives, Texas Family Heritage Research Center, and the Reference and Information Center - will be open

from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. the **second Saturday** of each month.

Maintaining the official history of Texas government, the State Archives includes archival government records dating back to the 18th century, as well as newspapers, journals, books, manuscripts, photographs, historical maps, and other historical resources.

In addition to published resources in the Texas Family Heritage Research Center, users have full access to the popular genealogical web resources including Ancestry, Fold3 and Heritage Quest.

The Reference and Information Center houses almost 2 million federal and Texas state agency publications.

It is hoped that with additional hours on the second Saturday of each month, along with the quarterly **Genealogy After Dark** programs, will make the materials more accessible.

Regular business hours are Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. The library is closed on most federal holidays.

Researchers using original documents in the State Archives for the first time will be required to register and must present valid photo identification and proof of current address.


2014 DGS Writing Contest
