#### From the President.....

#### **Happy Independence Day!**

Did you notice the FWGS web site (which along with many genealogical societies, lineage societies, and family name societies) was down for about 2 weeks starting June 16<sup>th</sup>. I know many of you <u>did</u> notice that Ancestry.com was down for a day or so and not totally functioning at full capacity for more days than that. The key in this thread is that our FWGS web site and thousands of others are hosted on Rootsweb, which is owned by Ancestry. Ancestry.com was hit with a **Distributed Denial of Service** attack by hackers forcing Ancestry to shut down to protect members and users. This shutdown also affected Genealogy.com (Gen-Forum) and FindAGrave (which Ancestry.com has recently acquired.)

Interestingly, this hit came in the month that Ancestry had announced quietly that they were "retiring" many of their products including: MyFamily, MyCanvas, Genealogy.com, Mundia, Y-DNA and mtDNA. The retirement deadline for these has now moved to Sept 30, 2014 due to delays caused by DoDS. GenForum has some reprieve, as the voluminous information in these postings will be kept somewhere, possibly in Ancestry.com. *More on that later*.

#### This Just In.....




Rob Yoder announces the completion of the project he has been working on for about a year. It is *The Footprints*Cumulative Full Name Index, 1998-2013. This has been a huge amount of meticulous work and now it is available FREE online from our FWGS web site. You can either use it online or download it to your own computer. This new Index is a great companion to the other FREE Index Rob completed in 2013 to update the entire Footprints collection in a Topical Index. Find both on the FWGS web site.
