

## **January Meeting**

Bernard Meisner helped start the New Year with an inspiring new presentation on how to make better internet searches. There are so many databases full of information yet the indexers were not perfect when they indexed those collections. Compound that with the fact that humans often wrote down our ancestor's information incorrectly. Often a fix is to check more than one database. (Ancestry is not the only one who has indexed the census; FamilySearch and Heritage Quest are 2 others.) Sometimes you need to overcome the misspellings by using wild cards in your search. Go back and reanalyze what you know and then do your homework. Check to see what records are available in the area of your search. See if there are guides or Wikis to help you learn more. Bernard showed us many examples where he overcame the search engine and found his man!

Wharfinger -- Owner of a wharf

**Wheelwright** -- One who made or repaired wheels; wheeled carriages, etc.

**Whitesmith** -- Tinsmith; worker of iron who finishes or polishes the work

Whitewing -- Street sweeper

Whitster -- Bleach of cloth

Wright -- Workman, especially a construction worker

Yeoman -- Farmer who owns his own land


