The National Library of Ireland will soon allow free online access to its archive of Catholic Church records collection online. The target date: summer 2015. This will enable millions of people around the world to trace their roots in Ireland.

The Catholic records pertain to 1,091 parishes throughout Ireland, and consist primarily of baptismal and marriage records. The earliest records start in the 1700's. The records are considered the single most important source of information on Irish family history prior to the 1901 Census.

Currently, the National Library provides free access to its microfiche records at its research rooms in Kildare Street, in Dublin. However access has been hampered in recent years by high demand and increased pressure on resources. The only online access to date has been through a third party paid genealogical service, RootsIreland.ie.

Other Irish Research News: Findmypast.com

Findmypast, the home of the largest collection of online Irish family history records in the world, has reached a major milestone with their Irish Newspaper Collection – it now contains 50 fascinating titles for you to explore! The archive of historical local, regional and national newspapers, which covers every province in Ireland, now stands at over 4.2 million articles and continues to grow on a monthly basis.

And in Other World News......

This time from Ancestry Around the World:

- Last winter, Ancestry expanded the availability of <u>Archives.com</u>* to users in the UK, and just last month in Australia and Canada.
- Later this year, Ancestry will announce resources for users in Germany and Mexico.
 With more than 58 million Americans claiming sole or partial German heritage and an estimated 34 million residents of Mexican origin, the new sites will give nearly 100 million people in the US alone, the ability to learn more about their family's story.



GENEALOGY on TV

As this edition goes to press at the end of February, *Genealogy Roadshow* (PBS) is ending up their current season. You might go to their web site and watch any episodes you missed. But if you missed *Genealogy Roadshow*, never fear! March brings the newest season of **WHO DO YOU THINK YOU ARE?** brought to you now by The Learning Channel (TLC) on cable. Premiere is set for **March 10**th (moved from original date of February 24) with 8 episodes. The only four celebrities announced so far (with a teaser about their roots) are as follows:

- Bill Paxton, who visits a Revolutionary War battle site to walk in his ancestors' steps;
- Julie Chen travels to China to learn more about her grandfather;
- Angie Harmon turns back the clock to explore an ancestor connected with George Washington;
- Sean Hayes jets to Ireland to celebrate his Irish roots.

Who Do You Think You Are? (WDYTYA?) is originally a British TV show and both the Brit and American versions have proven to be quite popular. And now, we can see some of the British celebrities from their episodes being shown on YouTube. I did not recognize many of the celebrities there except for Annie Lennox, Billy Connolly and Twiggy. 
