#### Barbara Roach Knox 1923-2016

Several FWGS members recently attended the Memorial Service of **BARBARA KNOX** who passed on January 2, 2016. We believe Barbara

was the last living Charter member of FWGS. She certainly was the longest continuous member and certainly one of the longest active members. Barbara held many positions in the society, but her longest tenure was as the longest serving editor of our quarterly journal, *Footprints*. Her most lasting legacy was as cocompiler with her friend and FWGS member, *Nan T. Samuels* of the Old Northwest Texas: Historical, Statistical, Biographical:

Navarro County 1846-1860 volume and with friend/FWGS member Weldon Hudson on Pioneer's Rest Cemetery, Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas book. A quick check on World Cat showed the Old Northwest volume in 82 libraries across the US, including the Library of Congress, Salt Lake Family History Library, Allen County, and NYC Public Library, and so many more. That is high praise for a genealogist.

She also wrote several family history books on her Amos Person's line and her Robert Hodge line of KY. Barbara was also an early computer appreciator and was involved in the beginnings of the TXGenWeb Project as website coordinator of several Texas counties, including Tarrant County. She stayed involved for 20 years.

FWGS sends sincere sympathies to daughters **Katie** and **Debra and their families**. FWGS will reap the benefits of her work and remember Barbara for decades to come.

#### Nelita D. Snow 1925-2015

**Nelita Snow** died on August 22, 2015 in Fort Worth. While not a Charter Member she had been a very early member (1964) and quite instrumental to the success of the society and its history.


Nelita came onto the FWGS Board in 1965 as the Recording Secretary, then held positions (off and on) the board from 1969 to 2001 as: a Director, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, Treasurer, Parliamentarian, and even for 3 terms as President (1974-1976.) She worked on other various tasks and committees including Bible Records, publications, and even planned several very successful bus research trips for the society. Our archives include a photo of Nelita loading a group of researchers onto a bus headed to Austin for the State Library and Archives there. Her willingness to pitch in, her leadership and hard work will always be remembered by this Society.
