MOCAVO Becomes a Part of FIND MY PAST

Mocavo, founded by Cliff Shaw and launched in March, 2011, was a private genealogical based web site and comprehensive search engine. They collected digitized records of many types and allowed patrons to base family trees there as well. Mocavo launched with a promise: "Free Forever." But, they did add two levels: free and fee. After launch they were immediately listed as one of the top 100 web sites in the US for genealogy. They also added a UK version. And they have continued to grow and add more records.

Now, **Findmypast** has acquired Mocavo and states it's "a move that aims to deliver a more focused, efficient and comprehensive service to US family historians." The move was expected to be complete by March 31st.

As they move all content over to **FMP** they promise "you'll soon be able to enjoy everything currently available on Mocavo and more. As part of our 'Free Forever' promise, Mocavo subscribers will continue to enjoy free access to all of the same records that were previously published for free on Mocavo." If you HAD an account you will still have your account.

Mocavo promises more information soon with some new how-to-guides. Here is more info for those with existing accounts (free=Basic or fee= Gold or Silver):

Existing Gold/Silver Mocavo subscribers: Your existing subscription will be migrated to FMP and when this expires, you will be given an additional 90 days to enjoy FMP. You can be assured that your payments will remain unchanged for your current subscription. If you hold a FMP subscription too, we will make the necessary adjustments to your two accounts.

Non-Subscribers (Basic): We will either merge your account with your FMP profile, or create a new one if you're not currently registered with FMP. If you have a

FindMyPast has over 4 billion searchable records worldwide; nearly 8 billion names. You can search, but need a subscription (fee) to see the actual records. FMP has been the leader in English speaking records from the British Isles (especially England & Ireland), New Zealand and Australia. They have added US records and now have acquired the records of Mocavo. They, as does Ancestry and now FamilySearch, have the ability to add Family Trees. All of these sites are a way to compete with Ancestry. You be the judge, try it out.


