November 11 brought Veterans Day in America. FWGS proudly thanks our Veteran-members who have served this country in peace time and in war!

Does Military Service run in your family? There are many stories out there of families that can trace continuous military service through the generations from the American Revolution or Civil War all the way to the present. Can you?

If you are looking for military records, try these:

1) **ANCESTRY.com** has many, many resources for military service from the national stage, down to regional, state or territorial. Some of these are for militias who protected the frontiers in Indian war days. Ancestry is a subscription service, while some parts are free. It is widely available at libraries and Family History Centers for free.

2) **FOLD3** is the digitization project in conjunction with NARA to make military records available to all. Many, many muster rolls, pension records, service records are already digitized. While Fold3 is a subscription service, many parts of it are free. It can be accessed free at the local NARA branch. Currently, they are in progress of digitizing all the 1812 Pension records. These hold many valuable records, such as affidavits, Bible records, lists of descendants, and more. Many have found dates of birth, marriage, death, maiden names, places of burial or marriage that may not be found anywhere else today. When I began watching their progress, they were on Letter C (by last name). Now, they are on Letter M. (M is a large data base, as will be P, R, S, T, & W. I am waiting on S!)

3) Lineage Societies. Examples are DAR & SAR (Revolutionary War), NSUSD 1812 & Military Order of the War of 1812 (War of 1812), SRT & DRT (Texas Revolution), SCV & UDC (Confederacy), Daughters of Union Veterans & Auxiliary to Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (Union), Military Order of Veterans of Foreign Wars, and many, many more. The ladies groups are for female descendants and the mens' groups are for male descendants, but the same ancestor could be found in both groups. These will show your ancestor's service, and then trace his descendants down to the family member joining the society. Some organizations will make copies of lineage papers for a fee, some may not. Some are making in-roads towards digitization. Ancestry has some of the SAR lineage papers already. Some of the DRT papers are there, but not indexed. The DAR has a magnificent web site and many of their 'open' lineage papers may be

purchased by credit card online and downloaded directly from web site to your hard drive.

The DAR, the SAR, and the NSUSD 1812 all maintain libraries connected to the military history of their respective time periods. The SAR is located in Lexington, KY and the other two maintain headquarters in Washington, DC. The DAR is open most of the year for research. Most will have fees for non-members and may be limited in hours and accessibility. It is always advised to check out the rules before planning a trip.

4) **Local Courthouses** often hold the Discharge papers from WWII vets. I happened onto my father's discharge while looking at marriage records in nearby records and found the book of discharges. [County of residence when enlististing]

5) **Try US GENWEB web sites**. There is a web site for all 50 states. Under each state, there is a county web site. Some county volunteers have compiled local muster rolls, some have member submitted material, some have stories from local battles. Like a box of chocolates, you never know what you will get when you explore these web sites. It always pays to check out a county you are studying. And check back often, you never know what will get added! I once found a WW I book of men who served from that county. It had been beautifully digitized by units/companies and even had photos of the men. http://www.usgenweb.org/

6) **Cyndi's List.** You may find some resources you have not found yet here. <u>http://www.cyndislist.com/us/military/</u>

7) Local Libraries and Archives We in FWGS sit in a very good genealogy seat. The FW Library and the Dallas Library are two of the best in Texas, even in the US. We also have the SW branch of NARA right here in FW. Not to mention that Arlington, Grand Prairie, Euless, and Grapevine all have very interesting collections. Parker County is growing theirs and a little know gem is to our south down in Somervell County in Glen Rose. And the State Library in Austin is adjoined to the State Archives.


