"Are You Descended From Kings?" Time will be 6:30 p.m. - 7:45 p.m.

Whether we admit it or not, don't we all wish we had Royalty in our line?

Tom will show you the names that are likely to lead you to royalty. (Tom has helped more than 150 people find they are descended from kings & queens.) He will show you easier steps to find royalty in your family history and then download the files into your Family Tree Maker file. Tom will then show you how to publish your findings in a book for friends and relatives. You will need to be familiar (at least a basic understanding) with Family Tree Maker and Ancestry.com for this part of the discussion.

THOMAS MORTON is a retired professional engineer from Canada. He has been doing genealogical research for more than 50 years and has more than 84,000 people in his Family Tree Maker database. He has published 50 family history books for friends &family and has traced more than 150 people back to kings, queens and emperors.

Thomas currently is a "Silver Frog" & teaches genealogy courses for the TCU Extended Education Program.

MARCH FWGS MEETING

Ila shared examples of what can be gleaned in articles & obituaries, then gave examples of web sites to find digital versions of papers. Besides the most familiar subscription sites such as America's Genealogy Bank (which is free in the FW Library & with your FW residential library card at home) and Newspapers.com (which is free at Family History Centers), she also mentioned some less popular. These were free: Library of Congress' Chronicling America project, Small Town Papers.com, The Olden Times.com, and Free Newspaper Archives.com. Don't confuse this last one with Newspaper Archive.com which is a subscription site for \$9.95/month. The **NY Times** has a subscription site and free archive with papers back to 1851-1922. The free section is called TimesMachine.

The **TLC** network continues the run of the highly successful TV show **Who Do You Think You Are?**


currently in season 9. It shows on **Sunday nights** at **9 p.m**. (Check your listings)
