Our May meeting will be Tuesday, May 30, 2017 in the Tandy Auditorium of the Central Branch Library. Connie Gray, Adoption Activist and Researcher, will present: "The History of Adoption and Birth Certificates in the State of Texas." You won't want to miss this very rare topic and event.

Time will be 6:30 p.m. - 7:45 p.m.

Refreshments begin at 6:00 p.m., with the meeting starting at 6:30.

Adoption Research is a most difficult subject and highly requested as a topic in genealogical circles. Connie Gray will address historical documentation, adoption law, birth certificates, birth books, as well as the movement to ensure accuracy of records.

CONNIE GRAY is a Texas adoptee. Adopted at the age of nine, Connie was determined to uncover her own genealogical truths. Upon turning 18 in 1976, she petitioned the Travis county court, obtained her original birth certificate, and within two years located her entire biological family. In 2013 she founded the organization Texas Adoptee Rights, which has been the driving force to restore access to original birth certificates for Texas adoptees.

Connie also devotes time to being a "SEARCH ANGEL." These volunteers help reconnect those families separated by adoption. She also will be actively testifying and lobbying in the Texas Legislature through the end of May for Adoptee Rights.

He showed us how to use Rootsweb and the Advanced Tab to find lineages to download from others who share the same lines. Who Do You Think You Are?

Who Do You Think You Are, season 9 has just concluded on the TLC network. Check their web site for encore showings or watch online. While there, check out their other excellent genealogy reality TV show: Long Lost Family, which deals with putting together families who experienced adoptions, oftentimes employing the use of DNA. In Long Lost Family you can literally watch an adopted child (now adult) take a DNA test, then with the help of the experts, go to Ancestry DNA or any of the other data

bases and find their blood relatives, sometimes bridging the long, lost gap to find their parents.

READ MORE AS THIS ISSUE AFFECTS TEXAS

TEXAS PONDERS RIGHT TO ALLOW ACCESS TO ORIGINAL BIRTH CERTIFICATES

The Texas Legislature is dealing with adoption issues right at this moment. Two bills are facing votes this month, both dealing with the right of adults to have access to their original birth certificates (OBC). Besides the obvious need of individuals to have access to their health histories, individuals would like to have access to their genealogical history: where they came from, their ethnicity, their global heritage.

Senate Bill 329 and House Bill 547 are both before the Texas Legislature now, both with multiple sponsors, and importantly, with <u>bipartisan</u> support. The group STAR (Support Texas Adoptee Rights) reports wide support from both adoptees and birth parents, as well as adoption agencies, medical groups, religious groups, social workers/agencies, the American Academy of Pediatrics, and many, many more.

Ftdna.com, Ancestry.com, and 23&me.com now have over 4 million people in their DNA databases, and it grows daily. The odds of adoptees and birth parents finding a genetic match are quite good. As demonstrated on the TV show above, adoptees are matching with cousins or other family and then working their way through the family tree to find the birth parent. With such degrees of certainty, these proponents ask- why keep the original birth certificate sealed?


