Hurricane Harvey Hits Houston Area

We probably all have been glued to the TV watching the devastation and we probably all know fellow Texans who were in the path and are suffering. Besides destroyed homes, have you imagined the destruction to libraries, to hospitals, to post offices, and to banks? I wondered about the safety deposit boxes and their contents. I wondered about doctors' offices and hospitals—what about our records, medical samples? But I had not stopped to remember that **Family Tree DNA** is located and headquartered in the Houston area. I received an email newsletter on just that subject which I want to share with you. **EDITOR**

Family Tree DNA in Houston is headquartered on the 8th floor of a high rise there. They survived and so did your samples! In fact, after Hurricane Ike in 2008 they did suffer damages and were out of their building for 14 weeks. Plans were made right then to better prepare for disasters like Harvey. They invested in a back-up power system that sustains power to the whole lab floor of their building. Your test kit has two parts to it. One part is kept in a minus 20 degree robotic cooler. The generator kept this safe recently. The other part of your sample is kept at room temperature and preserved by a buffering agent. That was safe as well.

President & CEO Bennett Greenspan says that is the beauty of keeping your samples safe and on file. You can have more tests done at future times as you need or if new tests become available. That sample of a deceased relative is still there.

While the headquarters was safe and the power backup worked as planned, employees could not get to the building. Flooding was in the area and did get into the lower parts of the building. There was some minor damage. Bennett was able to get into the building on Monday, August 28th, but his 10 mile commute took one hour. Employees could work from home to answer emails, the website stayed running and most customers never noticed a disruption. But five employees lost their homes and everything else.

The business was able to open again on September 1. The post office delivered 20 bags of mail and new DNA samples that they had been holding. (The main PO in Houston had been holding mail during the immediate flooding and delayed a bit allowing the local post offices to clear backlogs.) Bennett says they now have almost cleared the 10,000-20,000 tests they had to run.

Family Tree DNA is helping those five employees who lost everything and they are helping Houston. During the month of September, a portion of sales will be donated to Hurricane Harvey Relief efforts. As this goes to print, the total raised is almost \$12,000. Check their website for more. <u>https://www.familytreedna.com</u> For the employees, a crowd funding account was set up on YouCaring. 
