


Vietnam War records can be found on **FOLD3.com**. They list over 21 million records just for Vietnam with a total approaching 600 million records online. Of course, most of the Vietnam vets service records are not here and must still be sent for in the usual way. But take a look at what is here. Fold3 is a subscription service but many of the records on the site are kept free. And of course, the site can be viewed for free at the Genealogy room at the local NARA offices in Fort Worth.

FIND A GRAVE GETS A NEW LOOK!

Have you noticed the little message bar at the top of your **Find A Grave** page? It invites you to take a look at the **NEW F**ind **A G**rave site. You can click over to view the exact same page, just in a new format. You can make edits in the new page or create new memorials, anything--and it will save all work to the new and the old versions. In fact, F-A-G wants you to try them out and then give your feedback in the BETA version.

So here is your chance to say what you like and what you don't. This reminds of changes to ANCESTRY a few years back. And they heard you and made changes, so it is expected that they will listen to your input this time too. After all, Find A Grave is owned by Ancestry now. At the time Ancestry took over, they did say they would update. Let's hope they make changes to the search engine and make it better too.

EDITOR: I found the interface to be very "slick" and much more attractive than before. F-A-G always had a very rudimentary, low-tech look. I was intent on finding out if all the things I could do before are still there. They were. You can search for an individual by name or search for a cemetery. Once on your surname in a cemetery, you can click and find everyone of that surname in that cemetery. The maps and cemetery information is still there. Most importantly, all the bio information, pictures, links, and memorials are all still there. I encourage you to check it out for yourself and let Find A Grave know if they left something out.
