A column about some basics of DNA began in December and will run for several future issues.

Non-genealogists are sometimes reticent to take the DNA tests. Either they don't know which one or they are afraid they have to already have their genealogy done first before they can submit their test. You do not have to submit your genealogy BUT, that is how we all really make progress, by having a tree to explore where our common DNA intersects. It takes BOTH, the serious genealogists with their gedcom files and the casual DNA interested family members, to really further the purpose of DNA genealogy. That stated here are some common questions and we will explore the 3 Basic DNA tests available.

First, for the squeamish, there is no blood involved or invasive procedures. Most tests either involve a swabbing of your inner cheek or a saliva collection (spit in a tube.) Both methods provide the materials and collection vials, envelopes, directions, etc. They are mailed off with results usually taking two months. I have heard, that the better you "swab" your cheek the better your chances. (a little red blood is better) When your results are ready they are sent by email. You will be furnished a link to their site and a password. Results are protected. You will be furnished some general info about your ethnicity and countries of origin and if there are "hits" of other individuals in your company's databases. They can estimate if it is a close match or much more distant. Even at a 5 generation spread, there is often a lot of genealogy to go through to find a match.

Now, which test to start with? It depends on your gender. Males can take the Y DNA test which is valuable in surname searches. Males and Females can take the other two tests.

Y-DNA (or Y chromosome) Test (Males only)

Males carry a **Y** chromosome from their fathers and an **X** from their mothers. The Y comes down from each father to each son. (Sometimes there are slight

mutations along the way.) Since most males pass down their father's surname from generation to generation, this is a most beneficial test for men to take. Be sure to see if your surname has a Named Group Project. You can just do a google search, search Ancestry, and try some of the DNA specific groups out there. Some of the testing companies are not offering the Y DNA test any longer. Family Tree DNA (a Houston company) has continued to offer the Y DNA test.

MtDNA or Mitochondrial Test ("Deep Ancestry")

This test follows the X chromosome (female) from mother to mother back into time. Females carry XX chromosomes and males carry one X chromosome, so this is valuable to follow their mother's lines. For women, that means your <u>mother</u>'s mother, her mother, and so on; a direct female line. Mitochondrial DNA tends to be stable so a female may carry the same DNA back to her earliest female ancestor. Your results may indicate a match, but it may be difficult to know if the match is near (5 generations or less) or far (15 generations or more.) Again, not many companies offer the MtDNA. Family Tree DNA continues to offer this one.


atDNA or Autosomal Test ("The Middle")

Anyone can take this test and this can include results from the male/surname line or the female mtDNA. Or it can include any other relatives in your tree. This is because we inherit 50% of our DNA from our father and 50% from our mother. Together, this is your entire DNA.

Think of your pedigree chart from you as Number 1. Your father's line moves across the top of you chart. Your mother's line moves to the bottom of your chart. Think about all your other lines that are in the middle. Autosomal tests can help find lines through those ancestors too. The drawback is that autosomal does not tend to be strong past about 6 generations. This test is probably the test taken by most Americans. It is the one you see advertised on TV and usually goes on sale around holidays. It will show ancestry and ethnic origin (usually in nice graphic wheels or charts.) And the good news is that this test is available from the big 3 and the later companies too. This is good for you to make price comparisons. Always look for price breaks at Mother's day, Father's day, Christmas, sometimes, even St. Patrick's Day.

To Review: Males only may take **Y DNA (**females can have a father or brother take it) and follows only the father to father line. Anyone can take **mtDNA** testing for mother to mother lines and can go back very far. Anyone can take **atDNA** which takes in more of your ancestral lines (even up through the middle.)
