She came to particularly note that the Portal to Texas History and the Gateway to Oklahoma History are both repositories of digitized copies of various Texas and Oklahoma newspapers and of course even more. Attendees were lucky to receive a handout with an extensive list of places to find digital versions of newspapers in all 50 states. Ann shared how she was lucky enough to take a behindthe-scenes visit in Denton and in OKC to see the digitization process in action. With the Portal being sponsored by UNT, they have many more resources available than *Gateway* who is sponsored by Oklahoma Historical Society. That means it takes the Gateway longer to get their holdings digitized and on the web.



Diseases and Medical Terminology Your Ancestors Might Know


Have you discovered an illness or cause of death in your research that you did not recognize or understand? Here is a list of diseases or symptoms that we associate with older times. Either caused by lack of sanitation, poor diet, poverty, close quarters, lack of medical care or lack of understanding of diseases, some of these are quite rare except in third world situations. Vaccines and medical advancements have almost eradicated some of these. Some are names that are no longer used today or may not be used in the same way today, so check your records and see if you have encountered any of them.

Ablepsy: blindness

Ague: flu-like symptoms likely caused by malaria Apoplexy: Paralysis due to stroke Barrel fever: most likely Alcoholism **Biliousness:** Jaundice Black dog: depression Brain fever: Meningitis Breakbone: Dengue fever Bright's Disease: inflammatory disease of kidneys Bronze John: Yellow fever Camp fever: Typhus Chalkstones: possibly Rheumatoid Arthritis or Gout Child bed fever: infection following birth of a child Cholera: acute severe contagious diarrhea with intestinal lining sloughing Cholera morbus: possibly Appendicitis; nausea, vomiting, abdominal cramps, fever Congestive fever or chills: Malaria **Consumption:** Tuberculosis Decrepitude: feebleness due to old age Domestic malady: depression; emotional breakdown Dropsy: swelling caused by fluid retention; edema (could be caused by kidney or heart trouble) Dropsy of the brain: Encephalitis Dysentery: inflammation of colon; bloody mucous Falling sickness: Epilepsy Flux: excessive flow of fluid; hemorrhage or diarrhea French pox: Syphilis Green sickness or green fever: Anemia Grip, Gripe, Grippe or Lagrippe: Influenza Jail fever: Typhus Jaundice: accumulation of bilirubin, usually indicating disease of liver; organ failure

Leprosy: now called Hanson's disease; communicable bacterial disease affecting skin & nerves Lockjaw: Tetanus (or infectious disease affecting the muscles of the neck and jaw.) Was fatal in 8 days. Lung fever: Pneumonia Lung sickness: Tuberculosis Melancholia: severe depression Meningitis: inflammation of brain or spinal cord Milk Sickness: Tremotal vomiting; ingesting milk or meat from animals who ate white snakeroot plants Mortification: Gangrene Nephrosis: kidney degeneration Nepritis: inflammation of kidneys Palsy: problems with muscle control, tremors or paralysis Quincy or Quinsy: Tonsillitis; abscesses of tonsils Scrumpox: Impetigo Ship fever: Typhus Sleeping Sickness: Encephalitis Small Pox: contagious disease with fever and blisters St. Vitus dance: involuntary jerking; chorea; Huntington's disease. Sugar Disease: Diabetes Summer complaint: Diarrhea, usually in infants caused by spoiled milk Tetanus: bacterial infection entering body through wounds; characterized by high fever, headache and dizziness, tightened muscles of neck (see lockjaw) Trench mouth: inflammation, bleeding of gums often due to poor hygiene or diet Thrush: Childhood disease characterized by spots on mouth, lips and throat Tuberculosis (TB): Bacterial infection primarily attacking lungs, but may also affect kidneys, bones, lymph nodes, and brain. Symptoms of TB include coughing, chest pain, shortness of breath, loss of appetite, weight loss, fever, chills, and fatigue. Typhoid fever: disease spread by contaminated food and water with symptoms of lasting high fevers, weakness, stomach pains, headache, and loss of appetite. Typhus: infection caused by bites of lice, fleas, mites, etc, characterized by rash, high fever, headache, and dizziness Winter fever: Pneumonia
