The 2 new scanners are available for check out and allow you to save pictures to an SD card. Even very large pictures can be scanned one part at a time. The Flip Pal has built-in "Stitching" software that puts all the parts back into a whole picture seamlessly. The scanners can also be used while you are in the unit. Images can then be emailed back to yourself. Some volunteers brought pictures for the demo and had them emailed home. Several participants stated that they own the Flip Pals for personal use in genealogy and find them essential. FWGS was proud to donate towards their purchase. Enjoy!

#### **Certification of Genealogists**

Recently, FWGS was contacted with a question: How does one go about becoming a Certified Genealogist? Good Question! There are several ways. Today we will cover just one. There is at least one governing body to regulate, test and certify genealogists. It is the Board for Certification of Genealogists. 
BCG, a non-profit, was founded in 1964 by 4 members of the AGS and 3 members of the NGS. The CG behind a person's name is a Registered Trademark by BCG. In 2005 all 4 credentials offered by BCG were rolled into two credentials—the CGL and the CG. Before this, there were separate credentials for Records Specialist, Lineage Specialist (even an Indian Lineage Spec.), Lecturer, and Instructor. They publish a professional newsletter, scholarly papers, and provide seminars and lectures. (You can even find two presentations on their website.)

If you are interested in becoming certified, click the tab entitled Application Process. There is a free download of the Guide for this process as well as the actual application form. They also have published a book entitled *Genealogical Standards*, *Fiftieth Anniversary Edition* (2014). (Available on Amazon). If you begin the process, know there are costs involved. The preliminary application is submitted with a \$75 fee. When you send in your portfolio to be judged there will be a \$300 fee and you will have one year to complete your project after you begin the process. If you are successful you will be certified for five years and must pay a yearly fee (\$75). To keep your certification, you will be asked to recertify after 5 years for another \$300 fee.

A complete research-category portfolio will include the following materials:

- Genealogist's Code: signed and dated
- Development Activities
- Document Work (BCG-Supplied Document)
- Document Work (Applicant-Supplied Document)
- Research Report Prepared for Another Person
- Case Study: Conflicting, Indirect or Negative Evidence
- Kinship-Determination Project

Each part is scored and comments made. Portfolios are limited to 150 pages. As you can see, this is a very involved process and only for the most serious genealogists. The website does have a tab for the Learning Center, a chance to help you learn more.
