Ever wondered how historical fiction writers stay period-accurate while creating an engaging story? Sidney Thompson is the author of two novels about real-life figure Bass Reeves, the first Black deputy U.S. Marshal west of the Mississippi. Thompson will discuss reconstructing the past with a fictional bent and the line between fact and fiction. He will talk about how historyical research allows him to piece together Reeves's life and patch those with ideas from the present. For anyone who has ever been curious about the process of writing a story about a real-life figure or how to include realistic details in period pieces, this program is for you!

Dr. Sidney Thompson teaches creative writing and African-American literature at Texas Christian University. He holds a Ph.D. in American literature, with a specialization in African-American narratives, and an M.F.A. in creative writing (fiction).

She served on the Board of Directors for nine years as a director; from 1973 through 1981. She and her mother, Velma, were regulars at the monthly meetings for many years."

In 2021, RON WRIGHT died. Most all of Fort Worth, Arlington and Tarrant County knew him. First as the former City Councilman and Mayor Pro Tem of Arlington, then as Tarrant County Tax Assessor-Collector, and most recently as Congressman Ron Wright of the Texas 6th District. **But we at FWGS knew** him as one of our Charter Members of the Pioneer Families of Tarrant County (PFoTC), a sub-group of FWGS. Ron was quite interested in history and genealogy with deep roots in Fort Worth and Tarrant County. Soon after completing his lineage papers for inclusion in PFoTC, he was our guest speaker for our special 50th Anniversary Banquet and spoke about his ancestors in early Fort Worth. He was a Sixth Generation Tarrant County resident. It was quite an honor for us and he was a terrific speaker.

Unfortunately, Ron was suffering from Lung Cancer and then caught Covid19. He was the first sitting member of Congress to die of Covid19. His viewing was held in AT&T Stadium and his Funeral was held in the Exhibits Hall of the Will Rogers Memorial Center. **RIP Ron.**
