So, the basics are free, but many of the varying ways to sort and analyze your results requires a small monthly or yearly fee. Patti showed us how to compare your results with your suggested matches and what the degree of separation from you or your common ancestor may mean to your research. CEMETERY RESEARCH

Two great cemetery research resources are **Find A Grave** and **Billion Graves**, as

most genealogists have discovered. Both are similar with transcriptions of tombstones, photos of the cemetery and/or tombstone, and directions and information about the cemetery, even its history. Sometimes family or genealogists have added photos or biographies of the deceased and then linked them to family members across the country. Sometimes a researcher is lucky to stumble onto several generations linked together, that start on the east coast with Colonial dates and then move westward across the country up to the present-day deaths of descendants. Billion Graves was the first to modernize their web site with GPS coordinates and apps and even a blog and newsletter. But every step, Find A Grave kept up and seems to be the more popular site, especially with their ties to Ancestry. Now, Find A Grave has added an interesting newsletter for users or members. The first was just sent by email in May and is entitled Find A **Grave Insider**. They will include interesting stories, tips on using their site, and reader responses. 
