It's Finally Here!

The 1950 Census release opened on Friday, April 1st after the 72-year rule of confidentiality was reached. Apparently, the 1950 census is now available for everyone to view on a free, dedicated website from the National Archives: 1950census.archives.gov

Here's what you can expect to find on the 1950 Census website:

- Approximately 6.57 million population schedules
- 33,360 Indian Reservation schedules
- 9,634 enumeration district maps images
- 234,447 enumeration district descriptions
- Location and name-based search capabilities:
 Explore the records by State, County/City,
 Name, Reservation, and Enumeration District.
- Name transcription capabilities: Use the built-in transcription feature to correct and add names to the name index. You can help make the 1950 Census population schedules more discoverable for everyone.
