Well, I got my first ANCESTRY Hint from the 1950

<u>Census on my family tree.</u> My first searches to find my parents have not been successful. Neither were head of households, as they were not married yet. They were single, workers, and living in boarding houses or apartments on the west side. Both worked in the defense industry, a huge draw for Fort Worth, Tarrant county, Texas.

My hints from ANCESTRY were from relatives that were heads of households. Those were the first to be indexed. The race to get a more accurate reading of <u>ALL</u> names in the 1950 census and get that index on to the genealogy sites is on. <u>It will take many of YOU to help</u> <u>fully index that project</u>.

Will you consider volunteering to Index the 1950 Census? FWGS Director At Large Joan Crittenden volunteered and indexed Winston County, Alabama, Precinct 1. It was a county with her familial connections.
