Who were the original Populists and how did they shape American politics? Gregg Cantrell, author of The People's Revolt and the Roots of American Liberalism, will explore the historical roots of Texas populism and the hallmarks of the movement. He will contrast historic populists' contribution to the development of American liberalism with the identity of populists in politics today.

Gregg Cantrell holds the Erma and Ralph Lowe Chair in Texas History at Texas Christian University. He received his B.B.A., M.B.A., and Ph.D. from Texas A&M University. Cantrell received the Summerlee Research Fellowship from the William H. Clements Center for Southwest Studies at Southern Methodist University. In addition to his recent book, The People's Revolt: Texas Populists and the Roots of American Liberalism, he is the author of Stephen F. Austin, Empresario of Texas; Feeding the Wolf: John B. Rayner and the Politics of Race, 1850-1918; and Kenneth and John B. Rayner and the Limits of Southern Dissent. He also co-edited Lone Star Pasts: Memory and History in Texas.

#### FORMER FWGS MEMBER PASSES CLOIS B. RICHARDSON 1930-2022

Clois Richardson, a long time FWGS member and Board member has passed away. Clois served as VP, Treasurer, and Director, but led the Computers Users Group for many years after the library opened the Intel Lab. FWGS was indebted for his leadership & service for 12 years (10 on the board.) FWGS extends sympathy to widow, Peggy. Abbreviated obit below:

**Clois Burton Richardson**, 91 of Benbrook, TX passed away Thursday, July 7th, 2022. A graveside service took place at Elmwood Cemetery in Bowie, TX on Monday, July 11<sup>th</sup>.

Clois was born on December 28, 1930, in Bowie, Montague County, TX to the late Carl B. Richardson and Jocie E. Prince. He and his family lived in Ryan, Oklahoma for many years. He attended and graduated from Ryan High School. He attended Cameron University in Lawton, Oklahoma for one semester. Clois joined the Air Force in 1950 and was an Air Police. He served in Japan during the Korean War and was honorably discharged in September 1954. He was awarded the National Defense Service Medal, the Korean Services Medal - U.N. Service Medal, and the Good Conduct Medal. Clois moved back to Bowie and worked with the family dairy business. He moved to Farmington, New Mexico and worked at Haliburton.
